
Joe LaFlamme's Hats and Names

When Joe LaFlamme started traveling with his wolves, he also started wearing his signature costume. The emerald green pull-over style coat was made from a Hudson's Bay Company point blanket and was trimmed with fur. Joe also wore a multicoloured sash or fur-trader's belt, known as the French Canadian *ceinture fléchée*. A wolf-fur hat completed his touring outfit.



Joe has not only changed hats, he also changed his name. In the biography of *Wolf Man Joe LaFlamme : Tamer Untamed*, the author relates that Joe's birth name was Télesphore Laflamme. Circa 1917, he took on the name of his older brother who was a farmer, a line of work which exempted him from having to go to war. Then, sometime in the 1920s, Joe started signing his family name with a capital 'F', giving the Wolf Man more prestige.
